



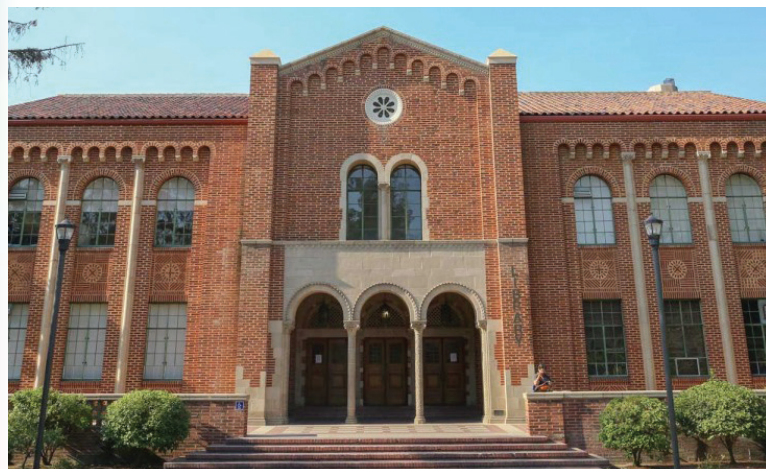

Course Description:
 Updated protocols assist us in determining our patient's specific needs. As we move toward a more collaborative profession, we need to embrace these updates to identify those needs. We are presented with continuous challenges of new advances in products and technology and their use in dentistry and are in need of information to determine when and how to add them into our armamentaria. As professionals providing health services, our perception of product use along with protocols needs to be discussed with our team, as well as the interdisciplinary referrals we have. The process of care (assessment, diagnosis, treatment planning, implementation, evaluation, and documentation) requires a comprehension of protocols, products, and treatment options and how they are to be utilized.

Periodontal Plastic Surgery to Assist the Entire Restorative Team

Course Description:
 If you purchase a painting and the picture frame is broken, no matter how much you appreciate the picture, you will still focus on the blemish instead of having total appreciation for the artwork. Similarly, if you perform ideal restorative dentistry but there are detractors in the final outcome, the case will be compromised. Periodontal Plastic Surgery can be a powerful tool to help achieve more ideal outcomes through new regenerative procedures allowing the restorative team to improve otherwise compromised treatment outcomes. Periodontal Plastic Surgery can put back the missing pieces of a compromised smile and achieve case acceptance, create the most ideal outcomes and satisfied patient expectations.

Learning Objectives:
 Some procedures are simple and others very involved but the benefit of teamwork has the potential ability to achieve results previously thought impossible. This program will highlight the perio-restorative interdisciplinary possibilities. It is highly recommended that the restorative dentist attend this program together with the team periodontist to cement realistic, doable treatment modalities and incorporate these concepts for the most ideal treatment outcomes.
